

## **Procedures for Cleaning and Disinfection**

Employees should routinely clean frequently touched surfaces (for example: tables, doorknobs, light switches, handles, desks, pens, toilets, faucets, sinks) with household cleaners and EPA-registered disinfectants that are appropriate for the surface, following label instructions.

Try-on garments should not be used until further notice. If a garment needs to be tried on, it should be considered dirty and cleaned before being used again. Please do not send anything back to the warehouse as clean unless you can verify that it has not been worn (i.e. not picked up by the customer).

Tape measures should be wiped down with an appropriate cleaner between each use when measuring customers. Make sure cleaning products have completely dried before using on another customer.

## **Hand Hygiene and Other Preventive Measures**

Employees should clean hands often by washing hands with soap and water for 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available and hands are not visibly dirty, an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol may be used. However, if hands are visibly dirty, always wash hands with soap and water.

Key times to clean hands include:

- After blowing one's nose, coughing, or sneezing. Make sure to sneeze into the crook of your elbow or a tissue.
- After using the restroom
- Before eating or preparing food
- After contact with communal use items
- After contact with customers
